WFNR is a multidisciplinary organisation with the goal of combatting disability and increasing the chances for participation for people with neurological conditions around the world. WFNR deals with the management and fundamental mechanisms of functional recovery from conditions such as stroke, multiple sclerosis, dementia and brain and spinal cord injuries, and peripheral nerve injuries.

In 1996, neurorehabilitation was in its infancy but there were stirrings of interest around the world. Professor Mike Barnes, then one of the few Consultants in Neurological Rehabilitation, decided to host the 1st World Congress for Neurorehabilitation in Newcastle upon Tyne, UK. The response was overwhelming, and the World Federation for Neurorehabilitation was born. We are therefore very proud to be celebrating our silver jubilee this year!

WFNR is now a dynamic and growing organisation focused on its mission to advance research, education and clinical practice in neurological rehabilitation worldwide. The organisation now has over 5000 members worldwide and is the umbrella organisation of 42 National Societies. The work of WFNR is facilitated by 37 Special Interest Groups covering the entire range of thematic aspects of neurorehabilitation ranging from elementary topics such as rehabilitation in stroke or TBI over guideline preparation and EBM to neurophilosophy, and also includes Paediatric Neurorehabilitation and Dementia. Starting in 2020 WFNR has significantly increased the frequency of educational activities worldwide.

Our ongoing extension of activities generates the need for raising money from institutional and corporate members.

Neuro-disability is increasing in our societies globally, not only in high income countries (HIC) with their ageing populations but also in low- and middle-income countries (LMIC) due to changes in communicable disease mortality and lifestyle. Neurorehabilitation can effectively reduce disability, improve independence with activities of daily living and prevent the need for people affected to become institutionalised. We are working on using digital technologies to reach much more people worldwide who, at the moment, lack access to any decent neurorehabilitation knowledge and services. WFNR works closely together with other international bodies as the WHO in a joint effort in the combat against disability.
