I am an associate professor at the University of Oxford, where I head the Translational Neuropsychology research group. My lab's research is situated at the interface between cognitive neuropsychology and clinical practice in stroke.

My first undergraduate and masters degrees were in psychology and cognitive neurosciences at KULeuven (Belgium), followed by a PhD in neuropsychology at the University of Birmingham (2010) and postdoctoral positions at Birmingham and then Oxford.

In 2015, I received the Lord Leonard and Lady Estelle Wolfson Stroke Association lectureship award, starting my independent research group. I was then awarded the Stroke Association's Priority Programme Award in 2019 and I currently hold a senior NIHR advanced fellowship, allowing me to focus 100% of my time on research.
