X IX CONFERENCE OF THE SENR (NOVEMBER 2021)

On November 25th 2021, the XIX Annual Meeting of the Spanish Neurorehabilitation Society was held virtually. It was moderated by Dr. Sara Laxe García and Dr. Rubén Rodríguez Duarte and under the title "Pediatric Neurorehabilitation", the following program was developed:

- 1st lecture: TCE in the Child Neurorehabilitation Unit. Dr. Renato Nunes. Rehabilitation Physician. Da Prelada Hospital. Portugal.
- 2nd lecture: Neuropsychological Aspects in Acquired Brain Injury in Children. Dr. Javier Tirapu Ustarroz . Neuropsychologist. Navarra Hospital Complex. Spain.
- 3rd lecture: Pediatric Neuromuscular Diseases. Dr. Nicole Voet . Rehabilitation Physician. Radboud Universitair Medisch Centrum. Nederland.
- 4th lecture: ACD Pediatric Unit in the Subacute Phase. A New Research Horizon. Dr. Veronica Cantarin. Rehabilitation Physician. Hospital Niño Jesus. Madrid. Spain.

Subsequently, the procedure continued with the oral presentations:

- ID 111 The invisible of Acquired Brain Injury (ABI), functional and socio-occupational repercussion: review of cases.
- ID 110 Effectiveness, adherence and usability of a teleneurorehabilitation program to guarantee continuity of care in patients with Brain Injury during the pandemic caused by COVID-19.
- ID 109 Neuromodulation of spasticity using the dry puncture technique: Literature review.
- ID 108 Self-perception of Multiple Sclerosis: the person in front of their occupations .
- ID 107 Hand assessment protocol in patients after Brain Injury .

The main meeting of the Spanish Neurorehabilitation Society had 166 views and the oral presentations had 99 views.

ACTIVITIES OF THE DIFFERENT COMMITTEES

A. Presidency:

- On November 26th, 2021 and as a member of the Strategy of the National Health System to the European Action Plan, Dr. Joan Ferri has been a guest lecturer on Advances in Neurorehabilitation.
- The Guide on "Guidelines of Neurorehabilitation of Patients with Acquired Brain Injury" (Guide number 2) was published in the *Neurology Journal* ("Revista Neurología") (official Journal of the Spanish Society of Neurology).
- Guide number 3 has been published: "Guidelines of pain management in Acquired Brain Injury".
- Guide number 4, "Specialized neurorehabilitation services for patients with complex needs after Acquired Brain Injury ", is in the draft phase and pending final review and publication, as well as the preparation of the introduction.
- there are several proposals for the development of new guidelines:
 - DCA Neuropsychology in Acquired Brain Injury
 - Disorders of consciousness
 - Open proposals: pediatrics, chronicity, spasticity, behavior, spinal cord injury, etc.

B. Institutional Relations Committee (Mrs. Sara Laxe)

- Collaboration of the SENR in the SERMEF (Spanish Society of Rehabilitation and Medicine) 2021 Congress. A lecture was held with the title "Pharmacological approach to disorders of consciousness and cognitive-behavioral disorders in the rehabilitation of acquired brain injury", moderated by doctors Carolina Colomer Font and Sara Laxe García.
- Collaboration in the SENR Conference, moderating the table.
- Contacts are in progress with SERDACE to hold a lecture and a workshop or two lectures at the next SERMEF Congress.

C. Communication Committee (Mr. Alan Juárez)

Achieved goals:

- The statistics of our website during the year 2021 reported by the SEN computer and communication service is:
 - 14 posted news (2 pending for the week of November 2).
 - October was the month with the highest number of news (n=6), based on information from the XVIII SENR Conference.
 - 77,859 visits to our website during the year (2020-1 data).
 - 3,559 accesses and downloads of our material: "SARSCoV-2 Recommendations" (2020-1 data).
 - 913 visits to the Newsletters section during the year (2020-1 data).
 - 9,275 visits to the news section during the year (2020-1 data).
- Updating our LinkedIn account. Which has remained active updating news along with the website.
- Update of our Twitter account. Which has remained active updating news along with the website.
- As in other years, the advertising and information campaign for members is carried out, together with the support of the SENR Secretariat, for participation in the XIX Conference.

Projects for the next exercise:

1. Generate a private area for members on the website, where, at the recommendation of the scientific and teaching committee, a repository of all members with data from the work center and contact details (eg email) is integrated to allow communication between us .
2. Carry out Knowledge pills on the topics covered in our guides on social media (LinkedIn and Twitter), to generate greater scientific dissemination as a goal of society, which allows us to be more recognized in the field.
3. After achieving the first publication of our guides in the Neurology Journal (official of the Spanish Society of Neurology), we will seek, together with the Scientific Committee and the Presidency, the publication of our next guidelines, once we have obtained the endorsements of different scientific and socio-health entities.
4. Next article to be published: Review of Guide 3: “Basic Guidelines of Pain Management in Acquired Brain Injury”.
5. A direct line of work is maintained with the scientific committee to prepare a response plan and press releases based on scientific questions in the area of neurorehabilitation at the level of the national media.

D. Scientific and Teaching Committees:

- Throughout this year, three scientific endorsements have been granted for different neurorehabilitation conferences, after examination by the Teaching and Scientific Committees.
- From the Society, the endorsement has been granted to the document "High specialization of the complex patient with Brain Injury", which was requested by UNESPA.
- Representatives of the SEN have contacted the Company to comment on any news.
- The SEN asked us to be the representatives in the Neurorehabilitation Area of the European Society of Neurology.

Following the line of action established at the beginning of the mandate of the current Board of Directors, work has been done on two new Guidelines:

- Basic Guidelines of pain management in Acquired Brain Injury.
